3. INFRASTRUCTURE

Our institution is equipped with a strong and reliable technological infrastructure designed to support both teaching and learning. We have 151 desktop computers dedicated to student use, ensuring ample access for research, assignments, and digital skill development. Additionally, 26 desktop computers are allocated for staff to facilitate efficient academic and administrative work. The campus is supported by 11 multimedia projectors and a small TV, enhancing interactive instruction and presentations across classrooms. All systems are powered by a high-speed 300 Mbps fibre internet

connection, providing stable and fast connectivity to meet the demands of modern educational activities and digital resources.

The college maintains a fully equipped and dynamic website designed to efficiently serve both students and the institution. The platform acts as a centralized digital hub where students can access essential academic and administrative services with ease. All students are required to pay their college fees exclusively through the secure online payment system available on the website, ensuring transparency, convenience, and accurate record-keeping.

Through their individual login credentials, students can regularly access updated syllabi, download assignments, receive seminar notifications, and stay informed about internal tests and examination schedules. The portal also provides important announcements, academic calendars, circulars, and institutional updates in real time. This integrated digital system enhances communication, promotes accountability, saves time, and supports a streamlined academic experience for both students and staff.

During the current academic year, the library augmented its collection with the addition of 140 books to the existing stock of 9,750 volumes, bringing the total number of books to 9,890. The library also provides access to 275 e-books, 30 magazines, 12 national journals, and 10 international journals to support teaching, learning, and research activities.

The reference and support collection comprises 315 reference volumes and 221 book bank volumes for the benefit of students. Additionally, the library maintains 208 CDs as supplementary learning resources.

To facilitate academic engagement, the library is equipped with 7 computers with internet access, subscribes to 7 newspapers, and provides reprographic services through a photocopying (Xerox) machine.

7. STAFF TRAINING / ORIENTATION

A Two-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on *“Teaching and Learning Methods and SPSS – Handling Primary Data”* was organized with the objective of enhancing pedagogical effectiveness and strengthening research competencies among faculty members. The programme was led by Dr. G. Hudson Arul Vethamanikam, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Administration, Ayya Nadar Janaki Ammal College, Sivakasi.

The sessions on Teaching and Learning Methods focused on innovative pedagogical strategies, learner-centered approaches, outcome-based education, and effective classroom engagement techniques. Emphasis was placed on integrating modern instructional tools and methodologies to improve student participation and academic outcomes.

The SPSS component of the FDP provided hands-on training in handling primary data, including data entry, coding, data cleaning, descriptive statistics, hypothesis testing, correlation, regression analysis, and interpretation of outputs. The resource person demonstrated practical applications of statistical tools in academic research, enabling participants to strengthen their data analysis skills and research publication capabilities.

The programme was highly interactive and benefited faculty members by equipping them with both advanced teaching methodologies and practical statistical analysis skills essential for quality research and academic excellence.

11. FUNCTIONING OF THE COMMITTEES

The following committees were formed and actively engaged for the betterment of students.

Admission Committee

Ananda College distributed 358 UG and 42 PG applications. During this academic year, 226 UG students and 28 PG students were admitted to various programmes.

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

IQAC involved itself in collecting data on all academic activities through the MIS software on the college website. IQAC documented all the common activities of the college with geo-tagged photographs.

- A one-day workshop on *NAAC Preparedness & Binary Accreditation Framework of New Accreditation* was conducted on 22.12.2025. Dr.Manickavasagam, NAAC Adviser, Alagappa University Karaikudi, acted as a resource person and enlightened attendees about Binary Accreditation.
- NIRF 2026 – IQAC uploaded the required data on the NIRF website.
- IQAC convened two meetings every month to monitor and follow up on the academic activities of the year.

Examination Cell

- Conducting internal assessment tests was one of the main objectives of this committee. Thanks to careful and systematic arrangements, each department successfully conducted the CIA tests.
- It also conducted semester examinations in a successful manner by following the rules and regulations of Alagappa University, Karaikudi.
- It also addressed students' grievances with the University, if any.

Career Guidance & Placement Cell

Career & Placement Conducted 12 Major Events on training the students for their career.

- The LinkedIn Career Kick Start Program was conducted on 23rd and 24th June 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. This two-day intensive program focused on building students' professional digital identity by training them in creating impactful LinkedIn profiles, networking strategies, profile optimization, and effective job search techniques. As a result, 480 students successfully created professional

LinkedIn accounts, significantly enhancing their global visibility and employability.

- On 04 July 2025, a session titled Navigating Campus Life was organized for first-year students. This orientation-based career program helped students understand academic planning, skill development pathways, and long-term career goal setting. The session motivated them to align their academic journey with future employment opportunities.
- The Resume Writing & Interview Prerequisites Training was conducted on 09 July 2025 for final-year UG students. Participants were trained in professional resume drafting, cover letter writing, interview etiquette, body language, and communication skills. As an outcome, all students prepared structured and industry-standard resumes.
- On 17 July 2025, a Competitive Examination Guidance session was organized in association with NAAmagal IAS Academy for final-year UG and PG students. The session provided detailed guidance on TNPSC, UPSC, and Bank Examinations, offering a structured roadmap, syllabus strategies, preparation techniques, and motivational insights for competitive success.
- The Times Pro Mobile App Training was conducted on 05 and 06 August 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. Students were introduced to AI-powered resume building tools and industry-certified online courses. The program aimed at bridging academic learning with industry requirements, and students gained access to skill enhancement modules and digital certification pathways.
- A technical seminar on Emerging Trends in Drone Technology was organized on 10 September 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. The session introduced students to drone applications in agriculture, surveillance, logistics, and defence sectors, creating awareness about emerging technology-driven career opportunities.

- On 08 December 2025, QSpiders, Bangalore – Free Internship & Placement Training was conducted for final-year B.Sc (CS), M.Sc (CS), and BCA students. Students underwent screening and technical evaluation, and 11 students were selected for free internship training in software and IT-related domains.
- The Naandi Foundation & Chemman Trust – Aptitude Training program was conducted from 19 January 2026 to 24 January 2026 for final-year UG and PG students. This six-day intensive training covered quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, communication skills, and interview techniques, significantly enhancing students' placement readiness and overall employability.

Campus Recruitment Drives 2025–2026

The Placement Cell organized five campus recruitment drives for job roles including:

- The NICE Education – Campus Interview was conducted on 17 December 2025 for the role of Communicative Trainer. Students participated in the recruitment process, and as a result, 9 students were successfully selected.
- On 22 December 2025, the Iragu Foundation – Campus Interview was organized for the role of Cursive Writing Trainer. Following the selection process, 15 students were selected for the position.
- The SS Enterprises, Chennai – Major Campus Drive was held on 28 January 2026 and marked the largest recruitment drive of the academic year. Students underwent a comprehensive selection process that included aptitude tests, group discussions, and personal interviews. The outcome was highly commendable, with 87 boys and 66 girls selected, making a total of 153 students. This remarkable achievement reflects the effectiveness of the Placement Cell's systematic training and placement initiatives.

- On 12 February 2026, the KVIM, Coimbatore – Campus Interview was conducted, resulting in the successful selection of 13 students.

The Library Committee organized an orientation programme for the first-year students about the use of the library, its collections, and its activities and services from 15th July 2025 to 16th July 2025.

National Library Week was celebrated on August 12th, 2025. During this week, a speech and quiz competition were held, and students from all the departments involved.

A Book Fair was organized to promote reading habits among students and faculty members and to encourage greater access to a wide range of books on 07th and 09th October 2025.

The library recorded an average daily footfall of 33 users, including both staff and students. On average, 3 books were issued per day. The student-to-book ratio stands at 1:13. During the current academic year, a total of 5,766 users accessed the library facilities.

Mr. S.Robinson and Miss.S.Harini from the Department of Computer Applications and Computer Science were recognized as the best library users of the academic year 2025-26.

Readers' Club:

The Readers Club organized a meaningful programme on 30th September 2025. Rev. Fr. C. George Fernandes, Principal of Ananda College, Devakottai, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. The programme featured a Students' Book Review Session, where participants presented thoughtful reviews of selected books. The session encouraged reading habits and enhanced students' analytical and communication skills.

Campus Ministry:

- The college campus ministry functioned for the spiritual as well as personal growth of students. Daily prayers before the start of classes were conducted by students from different departments.
- Holy Mass for Catholic students, motivational talks, and interreligious prayer services were organized effectively on the first Friday of every month.
- At the beginning of the academic year, an inaugural prayer service, the anniversary of our donor Josef Wiederkerh, the Patron St. John De Britto's feast, and the Christmas Mass were well organized.

Entrepreneurship Development:

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) played a pivotal role in fostering an entrepreneurial mindset among students, providing them with the necessary skills, knowledge, and resources to venture into the world of business.

The cell organized various programs, workshops, and activities aimed at nurturing creativity, innovation, and leadership qualities. Recently, the EDC organized two important events for the betterment of students.

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell of Ananda College organized an Idea Generation Program on 30th July 2025 for nearly 350 students. The program aiming to encourage students to develop innovative ideas and entrepreneurial thinking. The chief guests, Mr. Arumai Ruban Joseph, District Program Manager, EDII-TN, and Mr. J. R. Nagaraj, Assistant Director, DIC Office, Collector Office, Sivagangai, delivered insightful talks on new ideas, innovation, and entrepreneurship opportunities. The session inspired students to think creatively and explore their potential as future entrepreneurs.

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell of Ananda College organized Entrepreneurship Promotional Activities for the final-year students on 04th

March 2026. The session was handled by Dr. Victor Benevant Raj and benefited around 300 students. The program focused on motivating students to explore entrepreneurial opportunities and develop innovative business ideas. It encouraged students to consider self-employment and entrepreneurship as a promising career path.

Students' Appeal and Redressal:

This committee addressed disciplinary issues and also provided regular guidance to students.

Women's Forum and Grievance Committee:

The Women's Forum organized several impactful events and programs aiming at empowering and educating female students on various crucial topics. These initiatives included:

- *Skin and Hair Care* – created awareness among girl students about maintaining healthy skin and hair through proper care and lifestyle practices on 8th October 2025.
- *Redefining History: Herstory as a Movement for Gender Equality – Herstory as a Movement for Gender Equality*, emphasizing the importance of gender-inclusive historical narratives and social justice on 28 January 2026.
- *Awareness Programme on Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM)* menstrual health, hygienic practices, myths and misconceptions, and the safe use and disposal of sanitary products. She also highlighted the importance of awareness and education in promoting women's health and dignity on 30 January 2026.
- The International Women's Day Celebration was held on 06 March 2026 at 2.00 PM at Ananda College. The Chief Guests, Mrs. Geethalakshmi, Inspector, AWPS, Devakottai, and Mrs. Bhuvaneswari, Alumna of Ananda College graced the occasion. They addressed the gathering and highlighted the importance of women's empowerment and achievements. Various games were

organized for women, and prizes were distributed to the winners, making the celebration lively and memorable.

These events reflected the forum's commitment to supporting, educating, and empowering women by raising awareness of important issues impacting their health, safety, and overall development.

Scholarship:

Government scholarships:

- For the 2025–2026 academic year, the Puthumai Pen Scholarship provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu was awarded to students across all three years of study. A total of 70 students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 70,000/- in total.
- The Tamil Nadu government provided the TAMILPUTHALVAN Scholarship for the 2025-2026 academic year. 124 students benefited from a sum of Rs. 1,24,000/-.
- A total of 98 students benefited from the ADW Minority Scholarship provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu, receiving a sum of Rs. 7,63,600/-.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu distributed free laptops to the eligible students pursuing their studies at Ananda College as part of its initiative to promote digital learning among students. Under this scheme, a total of 193 laptops were distributed to III UG students, while 183 laptops were provided to II UG students with the total of 376.

- 110 students from our college participated in fine arts competitions conducted by 9 various institutions and secured prizes, including cash awards.
- In addition, during this academic year, the institution won the Overall Championship Trophy at the intercollegiate cultural meet conducted by Syed Ammal Arts and Science College on 09.10.2026.
- Adding to the list of accomplishments, Mr. S. Robinson was selected to participate in the debate program Savaale Samali, telecast on Pudhuyugam TV.
- Mr.S.Prithiviran of III B.Com CA directed a short film titled TRAP, which was selected as a finalist in a competitive platform, bringing appreciation and recognition to the college in the field of media and visual arts.

Alumni Association

The Alumni Association actively supported current students by closely following the progress of alumni and leveraging their professional networks to enhance employability. The Alumni Committee played a crucial role in connecting students with job opportunities, internships, and industry insights, facilitating career growth and bridging the gap between academic learning and professional success.

- A special Alumni Meet was held on 18 January 2025, bringing together former students to reconnect, share experiences, and celebrate their achievements. The event fostered valuable networking opportunities and strengthened the sense of community among the alumni.
- During this academic year, each department organized special meetings for their respective alumni following the Graduation Ceremony on 20th February 2026. These gatherings provided a valuable platform for

recent graduates to interact with alumni, exchange experiences, and gain insights into career paths and industry trends.

Parents Teachers Association (PTA):

The Parents Teachers Association was conducted on 30th August 2025 and 28th February 2026 for all Arts and Science students. Around 730 parents participated in the PTA meeting along with their wards.

12. STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRESSION:

The institution was concerned with students' progression to higher studies and employment. We identified the reasons for poor attainment and planned to implement remedial measures. Sustainable good practices were followed which effectively supported students and facilitated optimal progression. Our institutional provisions facilitated the vertical movement of students from one level of education to the next higher level or toward gainful employment.

Out of 231 graduates, 77 were placed in various companies, and 83 went for higher studies.

13. Financial Assistance from the College:

- A total of 69 students, who were either from economically disadvantaged backgrounds or were sports achievers, benefited from a sum of Rs. 2,28,000/- through the REEPS (Rural Educational Endowment for Poor Students) Scholarship.
- Students who completed their UG degree at Ananda College are eligible to receive the Alumni Scholarship. A total of 25 students benefited from this scheme, receiving a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- through the Alumni Scholarship.
- A special scholarship is provided to students who are parentless and unable to afford the college fees. In this academic year, a total of 40

students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 4,65,100/- through this scholarship.

- The Merit Scholarship was awarded to first-year students who scored above 500 marks in their public examination. A total of 11 students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 60,000/- in total.

14. Mentoring:

3. INFRASTRUCTURE

Our institution is equipped with a strong and reliable technological infrastructure designed to support both teaching and learning. We have 151 desktop computers dedicated to student use, ensuring ample access for research, assignments, and digital skill development. Additionally, 26 desktop computers are allocated for staff to facilitate efficient academic and administrative work. The campus is supported by 11 multimedia projectors and a small TV, enhancing interactive instruction and presentations across classrooms. All systems are powered by a high-speed 300 Mbps fibre internet

connection, providing stable and fast connectivity to meet the demands of modern educational activities and digital resources.

The college maintains a fully equipped and dynamic website designed to efficiently serve both students and the institution. The platform acts as a centralized digital hub where students can access essential academic and administrative services with ease. All students are required to pay their college fees exclusively through the secure online payment system available on the website, ensuring transparency, convenience, and accurate record-keeping.

Through their individual login credentials, students can regularly access updated syllabi, download assignments, receive seminar notifications, and stay informed about internal tests and examination schedules. The portal also provides important announcements, academic calendars, circulars, and institutional updates in real time. This integrated digital system enhances communication, promotes accountability, saves time, and supports a streamlined academic experience for both students and staff.

During the current academic year, the library augmented its collection with the addition of 140 books to the existing stock of 9,750 volumes, bringing the total number of books to 9,890. The library also provides access to 275 e-books, 30 magazines, 12 national journals, and 10 international journals to support teaching, learning, and research activities.

The reference and support collection comprises 315 reference volumes and 221 book bank volumes for the benefit of students. Additionally, the library maintains 208 CDs as supplementary learning resources.

7. STAFF TRAINING / ORIENTATION

A Two-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on *“Teaching and Learning Methods and SPSS – Handling Primary Data”* was organized with the objective of enhancing pedagogical effectiveness and strengthening research competencies among faculty members. The programme was led by Dr. G. Hudson Arul Vethamanikam, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Administration, Ayya Nadar Janaki Ammal College, Sivakasi.

The sessions on Teaching and Learning Methods focused on innovative pedagogical strategies, learner-centered approaches, outcome-based education, and effective classroom engagement techniques. Emphasis was placed on integrating modern instructional tools and methodologies to improve student participation and academic outcomes.

11. FUNCTIONING OF THE COMMITTEES

The following committees were formed and actively engaged for the betterment of students.

Admission Committee

Ananda College distributed 358 UG and 42 PG applications. During this academic year, 226 UG students and 28 PG students were admitted to various programmes.

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

IQAC involved itself in collecting data on all academic activities through the MIS software on the college website. IQAC documented all the common activities of the college with geo-tagged photographs.

- A one-day workshop on *NAAC Preparedness & Binary Accreditation Framework of New Accreditation* was conducted on 22.12.2025. Dr.Manickavasagam, NAAC Adviser, Alagappa University Karaikudi, acted as a resource person and enlightened attendees about Binary Accreditation.
- NIRF 2026 – IQAC uploaded the required data on the NIRF website.
- IQAC convened two meetings every month to monitor and follow up on the academic activities of the year.

Examination Cell

- Conducting internal assessment tests was one of the main objectives of this committee. Thanks to careful and systematic arrangements, each department successfully conducted the CIA tests.
- It also conducted semester examinations in a successful manner by following the rules and regulations of Alagappa University, Karaikudi.
- It also addressed students' grievances with the University, if any.

Career Guidance & Placement Cell

Career & Placement Conducted 12 Major Events on training the students for their career.

- The LinkedIn Career Kick Start Program was conducted on 23rd and 24th June 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. This two-day intensive program focused on building students' professional digital identity by training them in creating impactful LinkedIn profiles, networking strategies, profile optimization, and effective job search techniques. As a result, 480 students successfully created professional

LinkedIn accounts, significantly enhancing their global visibility and employability.

- On 04 July 2025, a session titled Navigating Campus Life was organized for first-year students. This orientation-based career program helped students understand academic planning, skill development pathways, and long-term career goal setting. The session motivated them to align their academic journey with future employment opportunities.
- The Resume Writing & Interview Prerequisites Training was conducted on 09 July 2025 for final-year UG students. Participants were trained in professional resume drafting, cover letter writing, interview etiquette, body language, and communication skills. As an outcome, all students prepared structured and industry-standard resumes.
- On 17 July 2025, a Competitive Examination Guidance session was organized in association with NAAMagal IAS Academy for final-year UG and PG students. The session provided detailed guidance on TNPSC, UPSC, and Bank Examinations, offering a structured roadmap, syllabus strategies, preparation techniques, and motivational insights for competitive success.
- The Times Pro Mobile App Training was conducted on 05 and 06 August 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. Students were introduced to AI-powered resume building tools and industry-certified online courses. The program aimed at bridging academic learning with industry requirements, and students gained access to skill enhancement modules and digital certification pathways.
- A technical seminar on Emerging Trends in Drone Technology was organized on 10 September 2025 for final-year UG and PG students. The session introduced students to drone applications in agriculture, surveillance, logistics, and defence sectors, creating awareness about emerging technology-driven career opportunities.

- On 08 December 2025, QSpiders, Bangalore – Free Internship & Placement Training was conducted for final-year B.Sc (CS), M.Sc (CS), and BCA students. Students underwent screening and technical evaluation, and 11 students were selected for free internship training in software and IT-related domains.
- The Naandi Foundation & Chemman Trust – Aptitude Training program was conducted from 19 January 2026 to 24 January 2026 for final-year UG and PG students. This six-day intensive training covered quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, communication skills, and interview techniques, significantly enhancing students' placement readiness and overall employability.

Campus Recruitment Drives 2025–2026

The Placement Cell organized five campus recruitment drives for job roles including:

- The NICE Education – Campus Interview was conducted on 17 December 2025 for the role of Communicative Trainer. Students participated in the recruitment process, and as a result, 9 students were successfully selected.
- On 22 December 2025, the Iragu Foundation – Campus Interview was organized for the role of Cursive Writing Trainer. Following the selection process, 15 students were selected for the position.
- The SS Enterprises, Chennai – Major Campus Drive was held on 28 January 2026 and marked the largest recruitment drive of the academic year. Students underwent a comprehensive selection process that included aptitude tests, group discussions, and personal interviews. The outcome was highly commendable, with 87 boys and 66 girls selected, making a total of 153 students. This remarkable achievement reflects the effectiveness of the Placement Cell's systematic training and placement initiatives.

- On 12 February 2026, the KVIM, Coimbatore – Campus Interview was conducted, resulting in the successful selection of 13 students.

The Library Committee organized an orientation programme for the first-year students about the use of the library, its collections, and its activities and services from 15th July 2025 to 16th July 2025.

National Library Week was celebrated on August 12th, 2025. During this week, a speech and quiz competition were held, and students from all the departments involved.

A Book Fair was organized to promote reading habits among students and faculty members and to encourage greater access to a wide range of books on 07th and 09th October 2025.

The library recorded an average daily footfall of 33 users, including both staff and students. On average, 3 books were issued per day. The student-to-book ratio stands at 1:13. During the current academic year, a total of 5,766 users accessed the library facilities.

Mr. S.Robinson and Miss.S.Harini from the Department of Computer Applications and Computer Science were recognized as the best library users of the academic year 2025-26.

Readers' Club:

The Readers Club organized a meaningful programme on 30th September 2025. Rev. Fr. C. George Fernandes, Principal of Ananda College, Devakottai, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. The programme featured a Students' Book Review Session, where participants presented thoughtful reviews of selected books. The session encouraged reading habits and enhanced students' analytical and communication skills.

Campus Ministry:

- The college campus ministry functioned for the spiritual as well as personal growth of students. Daily prayers before the start of classes were conducted by students from different departments.

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell of Ananda College organized an Idea Generation Program on 30th July 2025 for nearly 350 students. The program aiming to encourage students to develop innovative ideas and entrepreneurial thinking. The chief guests, Mr. Arumai Ruban Joseph, District Program Manager, EDII–TN, and Mr. J. R. Nagaraj, Assistant Director, DIC Office, Collector Office, Sivagangai, delivered insightful talks on new ideas, innovation, and entrepreneurship opportunities. The session inspired students to think creatively and explore their potential as future entrepreneurs.

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell of Ananda College organized Entrepreneurship Promotional Activities for the final-year students on 04th

March 2026. The session was handled by Dr. Victor Benevant Raj and benefited around 300 students. The program focused on motivating students to explore entrepreneurial opportunities and develop innovative business ideas. It encouraged students to consider self-employment and entrepreneurship as a promising career path.

Students' Appeal and Redressal:

This committee addressed disciplinary issues and also provided regular guidance to students.

Women's Forum and Grievance Committee:

The Women's Forum organized several impactful events and programs aiming at empowering and educating female students on various crucial topics. These initiatives included:

- *Skin and Hair Care* – created awareness among girl students about maintaining healthy skin and hair through proper care and lifestyle practices on 8th October 2025.
- *Redefining History: Herstory as a Movement for Gender Equality – Herstory as a Movement for Gender Equality*, emphasizing the importance of gender-inclusive historical narratives and social justice on 28 January 2026.
- *Awareness Programme on Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM)* menstrual health, hygienic practices, myths and misconceptions, and the safe use and disposal of sanitary products. She also highlighted the importance of awareness and education in promoting women's health and dignity on 30 January 2026.
- The International Women's Day Celebration was held on 06 March 2026 at 2.00 PM at Ananda College. The Chief Guests, Mrs. Geethalakshmi, Inspector, AWPS, Devakottai, and Mrs. Bhuvaneswari, Alumna of Ananda College graced the occasion. They addressed the gathering and highlighted the importance of women's empowerment and achievements. Various games were

These events reflected the forum's commitment to supporting, educating, and empowering women by raising awareness of important issues impacting their health, safety, and overall development.

Scholarship:

Government scholarships:

- For the 2025–2026 academic year, the Puthumai Pen Scholarship provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu was awarded to students across all three years of study. A total of 70 students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 70,000/- in total.
- The Tamil Nadu government provided the TAMILPUTHALVAN Scholarship for the 2025-2026 academic year. 124 students benefited from a sum of Rs. 1,24,000/-.
- A total of 98 students benefited from the ADW Minority Scholarship provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu, receiving a sum of Rs. 7,63,600/-.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu distributed free laptops to the eligible students pursuing their studies at Ananda College as part of its initiative to promote digital learning among students. - During this academic year, each department organized special meetings for their respective alumni following the Graduation Ceremony on 20th February 2026. These gatherings provided a valuable platform for

recent graduates to interact with alumni, exchange experiences, and gain insights into career paths and industry trends.

Parents Teachers Association (PTA):

The Parents Teachers Association was conducted on 30th August 2025 and 28th February 2026 for all Arts and Science students. Around 730 parents participated in the PTA meeting along with their wards.

12. STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRESSION:

The institution was concerned with students' progression to higher studies and employment. We identified the reasons for poor attainment and planned to implement remedial measures. Sustainable good practices were followed which effectively supported students and facilitated optimal progression. Our institutional provisions facilitated the vertical movement of students from one level of education to the next higher level or toward gainful employment.

Out of 231 graduates, 77 were placed in various companies, and 83 went for higher studies.

13. Financial Assistance from the College:

- A total of 69 students, who were either from economically disadvantaged backgrounds or were sports achievers, benefited from a sum of Rs. 2,28,000/- through the REEPS (Rural Educational Endowment for Poor Students) Scholarship.
- Students who completed their UG degree at Ananda College are eligible to receive the Alumni Scholarship. A total of 25 students benefited from this scheme, receiving a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- through the Alumni Scholarship.
- A special scholarship is provided to students who are parentless and unable to afford the college fees. In this academic year, a total of 40

students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 4,65,100/- through this scholarship.

- The Merit Scholarship was awarded to first-year students who scored above 500 marks in their public examination. A total of 11 students benefited from this scheme, receiving Rs. 60,000/- in total.

14. Mentoring:

Mentoring was a developmental relationship where a more experienced or knowledgeable person (the mentor) provided guidance, support, and advice to a less experienced person (the mentee). It helped the mentee grow personally and professionally, offering insights into their career path, education, and life decisions. - A mentoring setup was established where each mentor worked with a group of 12 students. The mentor took on the role of not just offering advice but also providing personalized guidance to help each student navigate their college journey and career aspirations.
- In this academic year, we had four mentor Care programs focused on academic guidance, personal wellbeing, career awareness and academic progress monitoring.
